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haven't spoken on this issue in the last couple of days, and I know it is a very difficult issue for everyone in here, and I know that there are a lot of people out in the lobby who are working this issue. But I hope that we make our decisions on this issue based on what, to the best of our ability, what we think is right. I don't think there is anybody in this body who has said they're in favor of human cloning. I haven't heard one single person say that, so I think we can all agree on that part of the bill. The part of the bill that is so troubling is the bill that involves research, and you've heard wonderful debate on that, but I'd like to follow up a little bit on what Senator Don Pederson said and say...and ask all of you, how many here got their degree in science? I know there's a few, not very many of us. I know I didn't do very well in biology. That's one of the main reasons I didn't get up and speak a lot on this bill. How many of us in here, let me ask a second question, how many of us in here have gone to seminary or have a degree in theology? There are a few of us, I know that, but most of us probably never even had a class in theology. We have our own personal beliefs, but have we ever been in a position to really examine our own personal beliefs like Senator Lowen Kruse was just mentioning that they were encouraged to do in theology? How many of us in here is an ethicist, if I can...I can't say that. How many of us? How many of us have really had training in the study of ethics? I don't know a single person in here who's had that. The point I'm trying to make is, are we really in a position to make this very, very important decision on which the public...the public is very, very divided? And I'm not sure that we are. Now, I know that the university has studied this issue. I know that there's nothing codified on any of the discussions or decisions that they've made so far. I know that it's probably an ongoing discussion and I think that's really...I think it belongs in a setting in which you have all three of these disciplines engaged. And so I would like to suggest to you that perhaps we ought to have some way of establishing that kind of a panel or that kind of a group that would study this in detail and in depth, and be able to focus entirely on this issue. Those of us in here are focused on a hundred different issues and our time is limited. I'm not sure that we should be making this decision for everybody in this state who have very diverse and wide opinions on the question.
