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Officer Employer-Employee Relations Act, I don't think that was the intent. I'm curious as to what--and we can ask some questions of Senator Synowiecki or whoever else later on--what are administrative sanctions, found in Section 4. In Section 4, in subsection (1), it talks about, any interrogation of the peace officer shall be conducted during his or her normal waking hours. Well, what if that officer works the night shift? Or...you see what I'm saying? They may need an interrogator there, so does the interrogator have to come in in the middle of the night if the police officer or the peace officer works the night shift?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: Then it talks about, unless the urgency of the investigation requires otherwise. What is urgent? And I know that sounds simplistic and petty. But what is urgent? Let's see, I've got a couple other things here. Okay, down on line...or, page 3, subsection (4), a peace officer shall be informed of the nature of the investigation and shall receive formal notice at least 24 hours prior. What if during the course of that investigation the nature of the investigation changes? Does that mean the investigation has to stop and a new 24-hour notice has to be given to the peace officer, or to the janitor, or to the clerk? There's a lot of problems with this bill. Again, as I said, I'm not going to support anything that's not properly drafted. And I am not criticizing Senator Synowiecki. He indicated to me that the lobbyist drafted it. He indicated that the lobbyist prepared this amendment that we're first seeing this morning on a significant bill and we're being asked to adopt it. So I'm pleased that Senator Chambers asked for a division so we can explore this significant amendment section by section. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Further discussion on the first part of the divided amendment, which is divided into nine parts. This is FA1419. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Synowiecki and his lobbyist are not going to get 33 votes on this bill. I've even had some senators already tell me
