Nobody ordered them to be cops. A cop who murdered, in my opinion, a black man, took a retirement, and was given it, and he'll get \$33,000 a year for the rest of his life for having killed an unarmed black man; \$33,000 a year for the rest of his, to me, worthless life, a cop. And all he has to do is say, well, I thought my life was in danger. Did you see a weapon in his hand? Well, no, I didn't see his hand, but I thought if I saw his hand there would have been a gun in it, so I killed him. So they say, okay, you're blameless, and we'll give you a \$33,000 bounty for having rid this society of one black man. And they give the message to the others, and another of Senator Mossey's former colleagues on the police department had killed a black man under very questionable circumstances, and one grand jury indicted him. But that was thrown out because one of the alternates asked too many questions, although that was not illegal. He was given a retirement. But you know what that rapscaillon did, what that criminal did? He then got a job with a firm of private detectives. And he had said he needed to be retired because he was so shaky and nervous around a gun that he couldn't do the work of a police officer. So now he's running a private detective agency. That's how they lie. That's the tricksters that they are. And maybe if I speak strongly enough, you all will vote against my motion and you'll keep this bill out here and we will stay on it and I will lambaste the cops. I have got files, literally this deep, covering cases where Omaha cops have murdered people and gotten away with it. Based on police reports, one man, weighed 135 pounds, had scoliosis of the spine, and was drunk. There was a big, heavyset cop named Matson on one side of a metal desk, another heavyweight female cop named Truckenbrod, that's her name, sitting next to him, and he's surrounded in a semicircle by four or five other cops. And you know what they said? This 135-pound man with scoliosis of the spine and drunk dead, he suddenly leaped out of his chair, grabbed this metal table, drove it up to the wall, and flipped it over on these two elephantine cops, so it became necessary for the others to come to their defense. And they beat that man so badly that he wound up dying a few days later. And those cops were found not to have done anything wrong. And I'm going to give them special coverage? They ought to have a higher standard placed on them. And when they're investigated, they ought to be, at the beginning, strapped into the electric chair,
