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Senator Mossey, with my hand on the switch. No, not mine, because I couldn't throw it. I don't even think cops ought to be executed. At my angriest moment, I don't think they ought to be executed. But they should not be given special privilege. And our process should not be corrupted and manipulated by, of all things, a lobbyist. A lobbyist put us into the circumstances we're in this morning. Senator Synowiecki could have stopped it. Senator Synowiecki should not work for a lobbyist. Senator Synowiecki has children. Now, he is his parents' child, but he's not the lobbyist's child. He ought to be told that lobbyist, I'm a grown man, you're not going to run this game on me; I know what I'm going to run into if I put this up there. So unlike my nice colleagues who will not hold the legislator responsible for actions he voluntarily and of his free will places, I'm not that nice. You know why I'm not that nice? Because every time this trashy stuff is done, it makes more work for me. I'm the one who is being punished by the lobbyist, not Senator Synowiecki. He doesn't have to say a word, and he can count on the rest of you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to vote to shut me up. That's what he and the lobbyist can count on. But you all are going to have to do it. I'm more exercised over this bill than I was over Senator Smith's ill-conceived bill that he brought to us yesterday. This motion would return this atrocity to the Judiciary Committee to be dealt with in the way that the committee sees fit. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on the recommit. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion on the motion to recommit LB 304 back to the Judiciary Committee, Senator Beutler, followed by Senators Bourne, Mossey, Synowiecki, and Chambers. Senator Beutler.
