But other people's principles obviously don't go as far as mine, or they're afraid, or they simply don't understand the issue, or they don't know how. But they're here supposedly to make law. This is a piece of trash legislation. I'm not going to pull my motion to recommit. And if you don't support the motion, I don't care, because that's just telling me that we're going to see how long the Speaker will let us stay on this bill, which is of no consequence, which has no justifiable basis in even being here, and which got us into the situation we're in this morning through the trickery, cunning, and conniving of a lobbyist. Senator Bourne is so forgiving of Senator Synowiecki. And I can understand it. He said he enjoys his company. I've enjoyed talking to Senator Synowiecki. But Senator Synowiecki is not going to cause Senator Bourne to do as much work as I have to do. He won't stand on this floor and argue against this bill till the cows come home, as he knows I will do. I'd like to ask Senator Mossey some questions about the bill, because his name is on it, and he's talking about the work that's going to be done, and maybe he can help me with some of this now.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Mossey, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Mossey, do you have a copy of the amendment before you?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR MOSSEY: AM2309?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR MOSSEY: This one, the one that's separated into the questions?
