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now on a motion to recommit and I would like to, again, encourage the members to vote down the motion to recommit, and kind of refocus, as we go through this section by section, in FA1419, that we're looking at Section 1 and 2 of the bill, I believe. Is that right, Mr. Clerk, Section 1 and 2 is addressed in FA1419?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Clerk, would you respond?

CLERK: Well, yes, that's right, Senator. So I mean it's page 1, lines 1 through 22. That's FA1419.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: And essentially, members, well, Section 1 just declares what the bill is, in essence,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...Peace Officer Employer-Employee Relations Act. And Section 2 essentially speaks to the intent language of the Legislature in terms of effective law enforcement and the purpose of the Peace Officer Employer-Employee Act; Section 3 or part (3) indicating that the act only applies to administrative sections (sic); and finally, part (4) indicates that the act does not apply to a police or sheriff's department that has adopted any procedures that, at a minimum, provides the peace officer with the same rights and protections as provided under the act with regard to such procedure. So, in essence, our first amendment in the divided question is with regard to Section 1 and Section 2 of the amendment. And thank you, Senator Cudaback. Thank you, Senator Mossey.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time, as you know,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, thank you.
