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end up doing is something we do with lots of other legislation--move it to Select File and allow the sponsor, whom I trust very much, to work out details with interested parties. I don't want to enact bad legislation either and it sounds like it may need some work. Move it to Select File. Let the sponsor work with interested parties to work out the details. And there's one other aspect of this for me. Even if you don't want to advance the bill, that's fine. If it comes to it, I still urge you to vote for cloture. If it comes to that, I would urge you vote for cloture. Then vote against the bill if, in conscience, you really think, no, this bill isn't good enough to move; it's not even good enough to move on and be salvaged on Select File. I'm reaching the point where I may vote for cloture even on bills that I don't support so that we can be a functional majority rules body. We're slipping, in my view, dangerously away from that, becoming a supermajority body. I don't think that's the way things are supposed to work in here. So, if it comes to it, I urge you to vote for cloture, even if you plan, in good conscience, to vote against the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Maxwell. Senator Bourne, and this will be your third time also. Thank you.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Landis, I couldn't have said it better. That was a very articulate speech and I appreciate that. You're exactly right, these are the exact people that we have to protect. But I want to go back to Senator Mossey, had a question. Earlier, I had raised the issue of whether or not...or I raised the issue of what exactly is included in the definition of peace officer. And I see Senator Chambers is talking to Senator Landis, but maybe I'll ask Senator Beutler. Oh, he's not here either.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.
