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FLOOR DEBATE

January 23, 2004 LB 304

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, I think I heard Senator Maxwell back here going on about how you all ought to vote cloture. Well, you can do what he tells you to do if you want to, but you notice a lot of the time Senator Maxwell is not even on the floor. So he's not going to stand up here and battle these issues through when I'm up here dealing on other bills. He comes from his position, lofty position, now that he can run for some other position from the Legislature because he changed his registration to "Repelican" and admitted it's so he can run for another political office, and he's going to advise you all how to run the Legislature now? Follow his advice. I don't care. You know I'll be on the floor, don't you? Well, let's just compare the time that those who give you the advice will be on the floor, and how many of your issues they're going to help you get around me. Mr. President,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I will ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Request for call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, those opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 16 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

Senator Dwite Pedersen and Senator Tyson, the house is under call. Senator Tyson. All members present or accounted for, there's been a request for a roll call vote in regular order. The question before the body is to recommit LB 304 back to the Judiciary Committee. Mr. Clerk, call the roll on the question, please.
