SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...opportunity to amend it before you vote for it.

SENATOR MAXWELL: That's right. That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And are you in favor of voting for it as it is? Because you'd have to vote cloture again on Select File, would you vote for cloture on Select File too for this amendment in its present form?

SENATOR MAXWELL: That I can't answer. You're asking about Select File now?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR MAXWELL: I can't answer that yet.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, I don't think it would be wise to start the process of taking a controversial bill like this, which even the introducer cannot explain, and say we'll pass it to Select File and then we'll do the right thing over there. I see nine...I see nine amendments that Senator Synowiecki has, and maybe all of that is a tactic on his part. But if there are nine amendments of his, are you going to vote cloture and send it on over there, dragging along nine of his amendments which he apparently feels are necessary for some purpose or other? When we've had bills before and I would dig in my heels and be very much opposed to it, there were people who could explain what the bill was supposed to be doing, even if I disagreed with them and disagreed with the bill. People supporting this bill don't know what it does. They don't know the limitations of the bill. I'm going to ask Senator Mossey a question, because he doesn't get in our discussions a lot, but he's been kind of discussing a lot on this bill. Senator Mossey, would you answer a question?
