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still make it work?

SENATOR BOURNE: Senator Mossey, I think that's a great question. Here's my concern. Okay. Senator Synowiecki or...has an amendment, the surprise amendment, that has been divided by Senator Chambers into roughly eight or ten parts. Then, if you look at the other pending amendments, Senator Chambers has 15, 20, 25 amendments filed, so again, what I'm suggesting is, is that somehow the lobbyist did a disservice to whomever by saying, hey, let's just get this out, without allowing the Judiciary Committee to make it better. Now we're stuck.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

SENATOR BOURNE: I want to make it better, but I don't know how you're going to do that, because Senator Chambers has (laugh), you know, numerous amendments on there. I'm reluctant to vote for cloture because the bill then might get away from us and we'll have a poorly drafted bill that's one step closer to law. That's why I'm looking to Senator Landis or someone else in here. How do we make it better given the situation we're in? We had a lobbyist say, go, just trust me, vote this out, we won't...it won't go anywhere without a committee amendment. So now we're stuck. We cannot, as I see it, file amendments to make it better.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Would you...one more question, please?

SENATOR BOURNE: Sure.

SENATOR MOSSEY: In the original green form, did you support that?

SENATOR BOURNE: Um...

SENATOR MOSSEY: Or did you see...or...I don't know if you actually...in the original form that came out prior to this amendment, did you have any problems with LB 304 minus this amendment, if this amendment was not...did not become the bill?
