In summary then, the ultimate effect of our amendment, AM2300, is to remove all language in the committee amendment other than the addition of robbery and burglary to the list of crimes requiring DNA sample under the DNA Detection and Violent Offenders list. If I might talk for just a second about the amount of money that we're talking here, there...if I can find the numbers, here we go...there are approximately 1,550 burglary/robbery offenders now incarcerated, and with 350 new customers every year. If you add the total bill to this, it's approximately \$90,000 for the first year, and \$30,000 for each year thereafter. We are proposing that there be no addition to the State Patrol's budget, but their budget is already \$40 million. One of the things that is noted is I cannot supply you with the exact reduction that will be present, but it is significant. Now, I realize that it's kind of a case that we're taking away from the army and saving the money for the navy, but nonetheless, they do interdigitate. One of the things, in talking to our officials in Buffalo County, was this, and I think it illustrates where we're at on the funding: A plea bargain versus going to trial, the expense is approximately one-tenth, and obviously a very significant savings. One of the things that they mentioned is that in paternity trials you no longer have trials. Once the evidence of the DNA is presented, then it's just a matter of bargaining where to go from there. Paternity trials have just about disappeared. The other thing that we should mention here this morning is this. If a state takes DNA from violent offenders only, the likelihood of solving a particular rape or murder is reduced by 50 percent. Therefore, I would ask that you support our amendment and that we proceed with a clean bill that deals only with adding those that have been convicted to burglary and robbery to the statute. As the saying goes when they asked the number one bank robber why he robbed banks, he said, that's because that's where the money is, and burglary and robbery, when you're talking about DNA, that's where the money is. Thank you.
