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SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I'd like to ask Senator Johnson a question, or several.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Johnson, would you yield, please?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR STUHR: Can you explain? Number one on your amendment says strike amendment two. Can you tell me what that means?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Well, (laugh) here's where you find out where I'm not an attorney, but our friend Senator Tyson was over here asking basically the same question. I referred him to the counsel that...the committee counsel. But basically what it goes back to, Senator Stuhr, is what we've been talking about, is that because of we are amending a committee amendment, it goes back to the last statement that I read here and that's this: The ultimate effect is to remove all language in the committee amendment other than the fact that the addition of robbery and burglary to the list of crimes requiring a DNA sample under the DNA Detection and Violent Offenders Act. So it really refers back to that, as what our counsel has told me to say for an answer.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. And, Senator Beutler, I see...do you have something that you might want to add to that?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Stuhr, I'm not sure whether your question goes to the structure of the amendment, or whether it goes to the issue itself, but let me address both quickly. Amendment 2 is on page 3 of the committee amendments. It's the very last paragraph that has substantial underlining. All of that paragraph relates to financing, and it relates back to the discussion I just led you through with not...we're not going to count on the federal funding that the committee was counting on, but we're going to another cash fund that we think we can use, and so we don't need this language anymore. And then the other part of Senator Johnson's amendment strikes Section 7, which is right above that. So did that answer your question?
