SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Johnson, Senator Stuhr. Senator Synowiecki.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Senator Stuhr, I agree, I think some of the confusion here is that when you print off Senator Johnson's amendment, or the committee amendments, it's formatted differently than the committee amendments we had in our file. So I think that's kind of the root of some of this confusion. Senator Johnson or Senator Pedersen, either one of you as I don't know who would prefer to answer this question, Senator Johnson alluded to in his opening to some confusion with regard to the community supervision of some of these offenders that fall under the DNA sample collections act that's already in statute, and the fact that, to be frank, a lot of offenders are escaping this requirement because of this, the confusion that exists. And, Senator Johnson, I think your bill represents, at least on the community supervision end of things, an opportunity to rectify and correct some of the...some of the problems that are out there right now. And in particular to the committee amendments, where on page 3, section (b), it speaks to, as a condition of any sentence which does not involve an intake to a prison or jail, it speaks to, within that section, the taking of bodily fluids for purposes of DNA sampling, and I think we could have an opportunity here to further define within this section exactly the protocols and procedures for probation officers, I think primarily we're talking about here, on how to arrive at collecting a DNA sample. Quite frankly, I don't think it's going on now. I think there's confusion between the State Patrol and the Probation Department, and for the most part, at least I know in Douglas County, I don't think collections are occurring, and perhaps we can use your bill as a venue and an avenue to collect this, to rectify these confusions. Senator Pedersen, if...would you yield, please?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Senator Pedersen, beginning in line 25 on
