don't...we were concerned about the fiscal impact, given the state of our economy last year. And I believe if this were in committee again this year, we would have that very same concern. And I've been in and out of the Chamber, Senator. Could you remind me what...first of all, Senator, would you...as I recall, when the committee heard your introduction of this bill, the fiscal impact was more significant than \$90,000 up front and \$30,000 a year. Am I correct?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Well, these are the numbers that the people in my office recently had contacted the Patrol and...for the numbers that would be available. So these are as up-to-date numbers as that I am aware of.

SENATOR MINES: Okay. It just seemed to me that we were talking more zeros when you first introduced the bill. But I do trust the \$90,000 and \$30,000. Senator Wehrbein cut me off at the pass on the fiscal information. And I'll be anxious to see what the State Patrol comes back with for their concerns, because it feels as though we're dumping this on the State Patrol, and I would like to hear what their reactions might be. And then finally, the...because we have...your amendment has changed the committee intent, and we haven't really had a public hearing on this, especially with the fiscal impact, I wonder what your thought might be to recommitting this to committee for discussion, to be brought out at a later date?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Well, I've been in contact with the chairman of the committee throughout this process, and that was not his suggestion, but rather to proceed with bringing this to the floor. He felt that this is one of those things that is needed in this state. You just look at that map that we passed out originally; we're way behind other states. And so, yes, we can go back to committee once more. I would think, however, that...and again, referring to Senator Synowiecki here, we'd be glad to work with him regarding this. We were discouraged from making...putting in as strong a language as what he is suggesting. But we would be open to that sort of thing,...
