January 26, 2004 LB 139

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Johnson. You've heard the closing on AM2300 to the committee amendments to LB 139. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on adoption of the amendment offered by Senator Johnson to the committee amendments, AM2300. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Johnson's amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: AM2300 has been adopted. Back to discussion of the committee amendments. I see no senators wishing to speak. Senator Dwite Johnson (sic), Vice Chair of the Judiciary, you're recognized to close if you care to. Did you waive? The question before the body is adoption of the committee amendment, AM1057, to LB 139. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on adoption of the committee amendments to LB 139. Have you all voted who wish to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Committee amendments have been adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Johnson would move to amend with AM2313. (Legislative Journal page 401.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Johnson, you're recognized to open on AM2313 to LB 139.

SENATOR JOHNSON: This refers in large part to what we have been talking about before, particularly with Senator Synowiecki, and that is the description of how we go about doing this. What our amendment does is says this: The naming and describing of an administrator through the State Patrol as a nonsworn, nonuniformed officer, to be the administrator of the DNA data bank for the state of Nebraska, and to oversee and lay out the procedures to be followed by all parties involved, other peacekeeping officers, court and correction system, as well as
