SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...that are benefitting agriculture in those metropolitan NRDs are being paid for by those people who live in the cities. With that, I'd give you back any of the rest of the time you might have.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Did you wish to use that 30 seconds, Senator Quandahl? He waives his right to use those 30 seconds. Senator Tyson, on the committee amendments to LB 32.

SENATOR TYSON: Question for Senator Schrock, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, would you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: As I read the amendment, which strikes the original bill, it says, and I'm on page 1, "In addition to the levy provided in section 12 of this act, each district." Lower Elkhorn, Lower Platte, they also would have that taxing ability?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, they would. The impact at the present time would only be on Lincoln, Omaha, and South Sioux City, however.

SENATOR TYSON: The phrase that you had in that sentence is "at the present time"?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's right. The other cities will probably be involved at some point down the road.

SENATOR TYSON: And the other cities also have taxing power of 45 and 5, right?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct.

SENATOR TYSON: What is that money for? Well, let me go back in time a few years, when I owned a business on Norfolk Avenue in
