SENATOR JANSSEN: So now this isn't going to be the end of it? I mean, it's not going to be just an NRD fee? Each city is expected then to also provide dollars by assessing the residents of those cities that have hard surface, say, parking lots or churches that have hard-surface parking, they will be assessed at that property level also?

SENATOR SCHROCK: If that's what their city council and city government decide to do. Remember, we're not implementing this; we're just giving the authority, so.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So each city then is going to be told...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Is it time? Oh, one minute.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute, Senator.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So each city is going to be told, you're going...you have so many square feet of hard surface and the runoff is going to be at such a rate, so if they aren't able to raise an adequate flow of dollars coming in to satisfy the federal government, then the NRD kicks in? Is that what I'm hearing?

SENATOR SCHROCK: They'll be working together with the NRDs to decide how to implement the plan and how to go for the funding. They could charge either one or both, or they could go partially with either one or both, but they will be working together to decide how to fund this program.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Schrock, has the Natural Resources Committee pursued any other avenues besides through the NRDs to help solve this situation? I know you're between a rock and a hard spot on this thing. It's not good; it's a mandate. Is there anything else that you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.
