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SENATOR PREISTER: ...the NRDs, are extremely strapped with what we have limited them...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Your time has elapsed, Senator.

SENATOR PREISTER: ...in raising tax money. This is an opportunity to at least provide a fee.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. President. Would Senator Schrock yield to several questions, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, would you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I will.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Senator Schrock. I realize the challenge that you and your committee have had relative to this issue. I still have some very, very grave problems with it, relative to the not-for-profits. Now, as I am understanding, the not-for-profits, it makes no difference whether it is a church with 50 members or 5,000 members--I'm using an Omaha example, Community Alliance for the Mentally Ill, who have properties, both community-based properties and places where they provide day services; the Adams Street Center, that the Governor was recognized...was visiting for last week; Friendship Home, that has struggled to try to find enough money just to keep its doors open; the homeless shelters. Now, if I'm understanding you correctly, these are all included in the fees that are going to be generated. Is that correct?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct, Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Have we not as a state, as a responsible public policy over years and years and years, maintained our not-for-profits' exempt status? I think we've been very careful
