SENATOR SCHROCK: (Microphone malfunction)...and I think there's only NRDs that cover those, because...

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...the Missouri-Papio also covers South Sioux.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right. Now, this doesn't cover your NRD, Senator Loudon, or any other rural NRD, because it specifically fines...defines the NRDs as those that include a metropolitan city, or the first class, or a city of the primary class. So right now it only affects two. In the future it might affect a couple more, if a city of the first class is involved. And let me tell you why they should be involved, and they have naturally been involved. In the city of Lincoln, it's been a great relationship with the NRD. I'll give you a specific example: Holmes Lake Park, Holmes Lake, built in the 1960s, polluted to the extent that it needs several million dollars of renovation that we're doing right now this year. And why was it polluted? Why was its life span so short? Because upstream, not in the city of Lincoln, but on the edge of Lincoln and outside of Lincoln's jurisdiction, construction was going on. And in all those years, we didn't do a very good job about controlling sediment from construction. And so the life span of that Holmes Lake project was essentially cut in half because all that sediment came down Antelope Creek and polluted Holmes Park. So what's happening? The NRD has formed a partnership with Game and Parks and with the city of Lincoln, who's paying most of the cost. They're dredging Holmes Lake. They're putting in effect a public information program upstream. They're doing more construction control upstream. What this federal program is, is more of the same, more of the same. And you've got to have the NRDs involved, because they are naturally involved. It's partly their problem. They're allowing the sediment to come down from outside the city to pollute the lake. Should they pay it all? Of course not. Should they pay a major part of it? Probably not. It...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
