SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Beutler, you have about 2, 15.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you. Senator Janssen, thank you. I think I would like to use this two minutes, and again I feel frustrated because there's so many things I want to go back to, feeling strongly as I do that most everything that's been represented to you has been badly exaggerated, but I want to...I do want to go back again and say this. I did file an amendment that I was hoping people would take seriously, and it's along the lines of what Senator Bromm has suggested, and it's setting up a special committee of the Legislature to examine the Campaign Finance Limitation Act and to recommend whatever changes they want to recommend to us for next session. And I haven't had much discussion with folks in here about how that committee would be constructed and that sort of thing, but if you want to look at the suggestion that I made, it's filed on this bill as AM2284. And I just wanted to let you know that I think it's important, too, to look at this and to make it the best that it can be.
