FLOOR DEBATE

January 27, 2004 LB 762

Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Burling.

SENATOR BURLING: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Isn't it interesting that I can agree with most of the statements that have been made by my colleagues on both sides of this issue, and it happened also in committee. As a member of the Government Committee, I was frustrated by the fact that there are good points on both sides. And the challenge that we face when we talk about campaign finance limitation I think is to come up with something that's constitutional, workable, and effective. I voted LB 762 out of committee and I'll oppose the tax...the motion to bracket, not because I'm in favor necessarily of LB 762, but because I think that it deserves a full and fair debate of this floor, because it's such an important issue. I would rather see our Campaign Finance Limitation Act improved, built on, fixed, whatever term you want to use, rather than return to absolutely no controls at all. And like Senator Foley said, why don't we use this opportunity to fix it rather than trash it? I agree there are problems with our current Finance Limitation Act, but the opportunity to improve it might be gone if we bracket this motion today. And I, too, like Senator Bromm, think that if we do away with what we have rather than improve what we have, it will send the wrong message to our constituents who, I know in my area, want some kind of workable, effective, constitutional campaign finance limitation law for Nebraska. Thank you, Mr. President, and I'll yield the rest of my time to Senator Beutler, if he would like to have it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Burling. Senator Beutler, you could have 2 point...2.5, 2.51 seconds (sic).

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator Burling, thank you very much for the time. I want to wade into a couple of issues, and I'm not sure this is the appropriate time with just a couple of minutes, but I might take this occasion to indicate to you that maybe you should take a look at the committee statement on this bill.
