Finance Reform Act and said it should be repealed? Not one single person. Not one single person. Senator Brashear philosophically doesn't like this bill. I understand that. Many of the people that he associates with don't like this bill, and I understand why. But there is no groundswell out there whatsoever. There's not even a single voice out there that's willing to come to a committee hearing and say this should be repealed, we don't like it. Senator Schimek, I want to get to the question of this assertion that certain donated funds have been given to the Campaign Finance Reform Fund, what I call the fair fight fund. I know you've been involved in these for a long time and I have a couple of questions. First of all, is there any legal prohibition...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...whatsoever to donating funds to the Campaign Finance Reform Act?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Schimek, will you answer, please?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you. Senator Beutler, I was questioning that assertion myself because, you know, usually when we establish cash funds part of the reason is so that agencies can take donations. I took it upon myself to call the Fiscal Office, and they informed me that, yes, indeed, that funds can be given to Accountability Commission. There's nothing illegal about it at all.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Then let me ask you one quick question. Can the people who give the funds dictate where the funds go?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I presume not, but let me tell you that the places these funds are coming from, according both to the Accountability Commission and Fiscal, is from people's...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...campaign accounts, which they're closing out.
