SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you very much, Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Synowiecki on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Baker, on your green copy, page 29, as it regards the issuance of a state identification card, there's new language. Does that remain in the bill with the adoption of the committee amendments?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, Senator Synowiecki, that is the case. And the reason that language is in there, it's the same for obtaining a driver's license, same language as for obtaining an ID card. It simply states in there, in both sections of the bill, the process, if they...validation of a Social Security number. That's required now.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: It's currently required for issuance of a driver's license; not currently required for issuance of an identification card. Is that right?

SENATOR BAKER: No, I think it's required also for a state ID card now. What the language is in the green copy is not changed by any of the amendments, Senator Synowiecki. And it is more a clarification of the process. If they accept a Social Security card as being valid and then, upon...you know, the Social Security Administration validation office is not accessible at that time, it allows for a person's ID or driver's license to be revoked and called in, simply cancelled.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Then why is all this underlined language, which represents to be new language, in terms of the requirements, or the hurdles or parameters of getting a state identification card?

SENATOR BAKER: It's dealing with...it's put it in a new section. If you'll...I'm trying to find it, where you must
