provide a Social Security number to obtain these. It's in the front part of the bill. It's on page 7, actually, line 27. And I'm going to check on whether or not it's actually required to get...a Social Security number is actually required to get an ID card. I believe it is. But on page 7, line 27...I'm sorry, that's also the same language you're referring to. I've got to get on the right page here. It's currently the requirement that you have a Social Security number to get a driver's license. And I will find out about the ID question for you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Synowiecki, are you...?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Baker, myself too, I need to read some of these sections and update myself. Appreciate the information. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. Mr. Clerk, motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend the committee amendments. (FA1429, Legislative Journal page 430.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if you look at the committee amendment, you see that it is one page and consists of nine lines. My amendment would begin in line 4. And the language I would strike is the following, and it goes into line 5: "line 21, after 'document' insert 'for consideration'; and." I would strike that. Now, if you turn to line...if you turn to page 6 in the bill, you will see what I'm dealing with. The language in the bill, before adoption of the committee amendment, says the following: "Any individual who presents a valid Nebraska operator's license or Nebraska state identification card may present that document for identification for issuance of such license or identification card." Now, what the committee amendment does, after the word "document," is to insert the words "for consideration." That language about the treasurer, and so forth, I'm not interested
