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valid Nebraska driver license and a Nebraska...a valid identification card, they're just presented for consideration. That doesn't make sense to me. So would you explain that, if you please?

SENATOR BAKER: I think what the green copy does is it...that stricken language in lines 11 and 12 is actually, in effect, moved down to...beginning in line 19, (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yeah, that's what I said.

SENATOR BAKER: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I agree with...that's what's done.

SENATOR BAKER: That's what's done. And it...the reason it was moved, stricken above and reinserted below, was they added that other language in there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But here's why I want to get to the language. You now, with this amendment, the committee amendment, would say that the valid Nebraska driver license and the valid Nebraska identification card will be allowed for consideration, but they will not, on their own, serve as identification. Do you agree that that's what the language says?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, that's what it says. That's...the amended language, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. So when you go up to line 12, a valid operator's license from another state or jurisdiction of the United States is accepted, not for consideration, but accepted for identification. That's all I will ask you. Members of the Legislature, this makes no sense at all. In the new language, you put the word "valid." That means it is what it purports to be. You have a valid Nebraska driver license. You have, in lieu thereof, a valid Nebraska identification card. They are not accepted at face value. But a driver license from another state or another jurisdiction of the United States is accepted on its face. So what I am doing with my amendment is to strike from the committee amendment those words, "for consideration,"
