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and it would give the same status to a Nebraska driver license that a license from another state has. The law does not say that the license from another state is provided for consideration as to whether or not it will be accepted. It is accepted. So, Senator Combs, because...let's say that Bush has his way and somebody is up on Mars and they stuck a flag and said, this is claimed for the United States. Senator Combs has done research on Martians. She mentioned it the other day during a discussion. I pay close attention. Because of that, Senator Combs was the first person dispatched to Mars. Well, when she got up there, she saw that the rover had been facing the wrong direction, and once it turned around, it would have seen this thriving metropolis. But since the first one did not send information, and had some problems with it, that was never seen. The second one wound up in a crater from which it could not exit. But when Senator Combs got there, she saw this metropolis. And after being there for a while, she obtained a driver license for one of their vehicles. Since Mars had been claimed by the United States, this now is a United States territory. So Senator Combs walks into the office to identify herself, for whatever purpose we're dealing with in this statute, because I want to stay focused. I, who have been earthbound all my life, walk in right behind her. She presents her driver license from Mars, and the clerk accepts that. I present my valid driver license from Nebraska, and mine is rejected. Does that make sense? I know some of my colleagues will sometimes lose interest when we're dealing with an issue in a bill that's very complex. This is not complex. This is saying that a piece of identification from another state or another jurisdiction which is a United States territory is accepted for identification purposes. A valid driver license issued by this state--according to the laws of this state; otherwise it wouldn't be valid--is not accepted. I think everybody in this Chamber understands that, except the Transportation Committee. I've had problems with legislation coming out of the Transportation Committee, and I've said it in the past. The only thing Senator Baker explained is something that I talked about when I first got up here; namely, that language stricken on page 6 was dropped lower on the page so that...
