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what they do, that...you're saying that the department has to accept that valid Nebraska operator's license as proof of identification?

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Chambers' amendment takes those two words out, "for consideration," on line 21, after "document." It does not leave that position of judgment, I guess you'd say, "for consideration," in there. And I support Senator Chambers' amendment. It would read as the underlined on line 21: "present that document for identification."

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. But...so what ultimately would happen is, after your committee amendment, after your amendment AM2241, and after Senator Chambers' amendment, the DMV would have to accept a valid Nebraska operator's license as identification for purposes of a new license?

SENATOR BAKER: That is correct. Either that, or there's a whole list of things they can present also (inaudible).

SENATOR BOURNE: Right. But they would be required to accept that then?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, they would.

SENATOR BOURNE: Unequivocally, they present that, that's proof positive that that is a valid license and they can get a new one.

SENATOR BAKER: The key word there, to me, is "valid." They...obviously, there are some problems with counterfeit drivers' licenses. If an employee would catch something that would say, hey, this doesn't look like a valid Nebraska driver's license, then they'd have some additional questions, and so on, that they'd have to have answered.

SENATOR BOURNE: Right. But...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...but of course the language says, valid
