Nebraska license. And I just want to make sure and set out in the record that an individual is not required to present any other identification. And as I mentioned, my constituent had a problem where she presented a valid passport, and basically had to make two trips to the DMV, because they didn't think it was valid, or there was a problem. So if she presented her valid Nebraska license, simply as renewing it, the department must accept that, or the treasurer, or whoever we go to in various counties, they must accept that as proof of identification.

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct. And I do need to point out, these are not DMV employees we're having problems with. These are county treasurers' employees.

SENATOR BOURNE: I understand. And I'm not trying to say that they're...I'm just saying there I think there are problems with the existing system. And then if we add new requirements as it relates to identification, I can just see more problems as well. Senator Baker, I have one last question. On page 10, it talks about someone who tampers with a driver's license.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry. Time is up, Senator Bourne. Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. As a member of the Transportation Committee, I had the opportunity to work on this bill, and it's probably the most work I've ever done on a bill, because in its original form, it was probably the ugliest thing I've ever seen. The problem we have in outstate Nebraska, of course, is...one of the big problems is uninsured motorists. And most of the reasons that some people are uninsured is because they don't have an opportunity to get a driver's license. And we as a state, by presenting this bill in its green copy original form, were really, I felt, throwing up roadblocks to prevent people from being able to get a driver's license and being able to get insurance. So we really...I really put up a fight and a struggle to try to get this bill in the shape it's in now. I still have a huge problem with the Social Security part of it. I don't really see where that belongs in there. I don't see where that has anything to do with getting a driver's license.
