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But then it was explained to me that that was in the original language, and that had to be in there. I am still not comfortable with what we have before us today. I certainly understand what Senator Baker's trying to say. I just am not sure that I agree with it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator Baker, on the Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I'd be glad to give some time to Senator Bourne. He had a question, I believe, on...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BAKER: ...on the bill, and I...

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, members. Thank you, Senator Baker. What my question was, on page 10 we've got new language in there that talks about a person who knowingly manufactures, copies, or falsifies a document, or changes the endorsement of an operator's license. What is the current penalty for doing that in statute today?

SENATOR BAKER: It is the same, Class IV felony. It's language dealing...and I have...I can't...it's a Uniform Motor Vehicle Information Act.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay, so today it is a Class IV felony if you alter or change a driver's license?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, it is.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. Senator Baker, thank you very much. And I do appreciate you yielding me time, and I appreciate your willingness to work on these issues and answer questions, because I do think that this is a bill that raises concerns in many of our constituents' minds. And I'm glad we have the opportunity to make this bill better. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne.
