SENATOR BAKER: Number one, I would assume, unless it's obviously an invalid Social Security card number...say somebody comes in and gives them a wrong set of numbers, too many numbers, not enough, something like that, they're not going to issue that. It...the alternative, the flip side of this is, if you can't validate it, they're simply not going to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...use their judgment and issue a card until they can validate it; they're going to make that person come back when the database is acceptable to validate it before they will issue this. So this provides some flexibility for the...in this case, the issuing people, the clerk, or DMV, whereby if they didn't have this flexibility and they couldn't validate the Social Security number, they're just going to say, no, we can't validate it, we're not going to give you a card; you're going to have to come back later when we can validate it. So this does provide some flexibility on both sides, the issuer and the person receiving the card.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Baker. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. Senator Chambers, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on your amendment to the Transportation Committee amendments to LB 559.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I didn't comment any further on my amendment once Senator Baker said he supports it.
