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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Then let's make it 15 on the Interstate.

SENATOR BAKER: That would affect a CDL holder's license. They would, I think, be on probation...I'm speaking here without looking these up, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. Because this is just...

SENATOR BAKER: ...I believe they'd be on probation six months, a so-called probationary period, at which time I...you're allowed, I think, the one ticket, and then after six...if you get another ticket within that time frame, then you would have, I think, a six-month suspension of your CDL. I'm going to have to check on these, but that's off the top of my head. I think it's correct, though.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I had gotten a call from a person with the question that I'm posing to you, and I gave basically the same answer you just gave. So if you are incorrect, so was I. But my argument, even though I couldn't remember that having been put into the law, was this notion of a higher standard because of the type of employment this person has. So I will accept what you said, and I will not have to do any further research. Thank you, Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bourne, on the advancement.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Baker, would you yield for one last question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I will answer.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Baker. And again, I appreciate your willingness to work on this bill. I just want to go over exactly where we're at after the committee amendment and your amendment and Senator Chambers' amendment. So right
