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one in Nebraska we visited, not meaning that we couldn't do a better job in Nebraska or maybe that one was run better than some. The morale was a vast contrast too. I talked to one lady just privately and I said how did she feel about the management and things like that, and she said, well, I can't believe that I get paid for this job because I feel like we can accomplish so much. And she was one working in the juvenile part of it and what they was doing to those kids, and this was a private managed. And I guess I just feel like that maybe we should have that option. I'm not sure that Grand Island or Hall County is even going to go that way. They are in the process right now of, I think, the...of drawing up the plans, and I'm not sure where they are in the bid letting, but I think that...and not necessarily that they're even going to go the option of a privately managed, but I think that should be available. I think it could be run very well. I do believe that if we do have private management that we need to stipulate that they abide by all the regulations and the rules, what the same as what our state-run operations are. And I don't know that I see that in the bill, but we need to make sure that they abide by the same regulations that we do and rules. But I think it can be done very well. One thing, when the privately was built and managed and everything, it took no tax dollars. The city that it was built in was not obligated to anything. The privately managed operation was able to operate because of, on the INS facility, that the money that they got from the federal government for each prisoner. But I think it can be done and I think it's going to be operated very well, and I know that there are other opinions that maybe think we shouldn't start down that path, and maybe they're legitimate, but I really feel comfortable with just what I've seen in the operation of this one in Texas, or these couple in Texas. So with that, I'll conclude and thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Senator Schimek, on the Chambers motion.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I rise, I guess, for a point of information. I'd like...I'd like to just share with you a couple of things. First of all, the private prison bill was LB 85, which we passed in 2001, and I
