able to make the decision one way or the other.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. Well, I just wanted to bring that to the body's attention and say that I think that, at least from my perspective, it looks like they're going to go in the other direction, and I'm not sure that we need to do this, this year. But even if that's not true and even if they do want it on the table, I guess I think this is a policy that we discussed and debated several years ago, made a decision on, and I just wanted people to be aware that we as a body did that. So with that, Mr. President, I will yield my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I have...I have several questions and I would like to engage in a little bit of a dialogue with Senator Aguilar, if he would respond, please.

SENATOR AGUILAR: I will.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Presently, Hall County, the jail that they have, is that a county jail that they have right now?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, it is.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Is that jail up to jail standards, or is there anything that would influence them to go to another jail or to build a new jail?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Right now, the condition of the jail is very poor. I would say it is not up to standard.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: It's not up to standards. And if they ever...they can still house prisoners in there because it's not up to standards, but if they don't do anything they can still
