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SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...in an age of information technology that far exceeds many of our imaginations from years ago.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Foley made a great show, and I emphasize show, the last time we discussed this bill about a young woman named Anyse Wisdom coming to him and telling her...him how offended she was that this information was passed out. Nobody challenged him. I didn't even know if such a person existed. But I got a call from the young lady after our debate, and she asked me what my opinion is on the bill. I told her I am totally opposed to it. I said, your name was mentioned on the floor by Senator Foley as the young woman who came to him and said she was offended that this information was handed out at school. I told her my view is entirely different from yours and Senator Foley's. I think information is of value, knowledge is power, and this information ought to be made available to these young women. Do you know what she told me? I'm not opposed to the information being handed out. And I give her name, Anyse Wisdom, and Senator Foley can call her. Do you know what she said she objected to? That there was not something included in the information about adoption and alternatives to abortion. She said that's what offended her. I told her that the purpose of this information that the statute requires is to give direction as to where accurate information could be obtained and not to carry on a debate about abortion or nonabortion. And the kind of information she wanted on the document should not be there and I would oppose its being there. Now I think Senator Foley either deliberately misrepresented what the young lady said or he withheld some of what she said. Now I'm telling you on the floor and I'm saying it emphatically, and if she or her family are watching, they will hear my comments. She said she didn't think that people should be deprived of that information, but she thought additional information ought to be there. I view with a jaundiced eye much of what is said on this floor by these fanatical anti-choice people. It was those fanatics who got words into our statutes such as "unborn child." You know what they used to say before I hit them so hard? That as soon as an egg is fertilized that's a complete human being. Now they've
