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her father should be allowed to have an abortion?

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator Chambers, I think you're getting into an area that's far afield from where this bill is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if a young woman...

SENATOR FOLEY: You keep talking about questions associated with Roe v. Wade, and whether or not...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If a young woman had been impregnated by her father and she lives only with her father, and she has to give parental notification under the law, he is the one she would have to notify that she was going to get an abortion. Isn't that true, under the law as...

SENATOR FOLEY: She would not have had to notify him, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Say it again.

SENATOR FOLEY: She would not have to notify her father in a situation like that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You believe she could get her abortion without notifying him?

SENATOR FOLEY: That's what the law provides.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how would she do that?

SENATOR FOLEY: Through the judicial bypass process.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how would she know about that?

SENATOR FOLEY: Through a wide variety of means.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Foley. I won't carry you through all that. Members of the Legislature, I think the point that I'm making has been made. If a young woman is in that set of circumstances, information should be available to her. She should not have to tell a nurse, a school counselor, anybody
