And I know there are people who will say it was better that the pregnancy be carried to term and the child killed than to notify the young woman of how to obtain an abortion and she obtained an abortion. There are dilemmas in this world. That means you're presented with a situation, there are two alternatives, and neither one is desirable. Which one should you take? When a person is faced with a serious dilemma in his or her life, others should not try to dictate what that person's decision ought to be, nor should they try to impose their personal views and beliefs on that person, because a member of their family may be similarly situated, and suddenly the self-righteousness goes out the window. Because there have been priests who helped women that they impregnated obtain abortions, and that came out during the scandals where priests were attacking little boys and little girls. And I'm sure those priests had preached against abortion, and probably illicit sex. But when it came to themselves, everything suddenly took on a very real tinge, and his conduct deviated from what he had been preaching and telling other people they ought to do. The only thing this information that is being given to these young women will do is to inform them. Senator Schimek's amendment allows the information to be posted in a prominent place, rather than each student being presented with the information. I am in favor of the law as it stands. Whatever Senator Withem may have decided to do, for whatever reasons, is not going to change my mind. I believe in knowledge. I believe in understanding.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
