SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard both reviews by Senator Schimek and Senator Chambers. Now we're open for discussion on FA1438 to AM2361, offered by Senator Schimek to LB 172. Senator Chambers, on your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, there was a lot of snow that fell overnight and during the early morning hours, and it was very difficult, as a result of that, for me to get down here this morning. Were it not for this bill, I would not have even attempted to come. After shoveling my driveway, which is very long, I had to shovel part of the street onto which my driveway emptied because there was only one set of tire tracks and the snow was very deep. So I had to shovel a good space open in the street so I could back out and line my tires up with those tracks in the street and make it to the first cross street. When I got to that street and came to what is known as Florence Boulevard, which is a main street in Omaha, what to my wandering eye should appear but a barricade virtually across Binney Street. I was on Binney Street. I prepare for unexpected-expected contingencies. So I have a snow shovel. Instead of trying to break through the barricade, I stopped, put on my flashers, nobody was about to run up on me because it was shortly after 6:30 a.m. And I shoveled my way through that barricade, returned my shovel to my car, turned off my blinkers and drove through the opening that I had made.
