friends of an ordered society, are not the friends of a democracy, are not the friends of Senator Mike Friend. They are not the friends of anybody other than those who want to mislead and take advantage of people or a situation. No outcry has arisen because of the present law. No harm has been shown to have resulted from it. If that were the case, we would have been presented those examples over and over and over, ad nauseam. But there are no such examples. I hope that you will adopt my amendment. Then the other matters we can continue to discuss, and I will continue to try to reason with my colleagues using examples that are not in the realm of abortion or antiabortion, but in the wider world to show where correct, accurate, valid, trustworthy, credible, reliable information is sought after and should always be provided when we're dealing with young people. Every position that I take on this floor is one that I can live with decades down the line because I think about positions. I think about the impact of them on the people who are concerned with that decision, not just intellectually, but because it will have an...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...effect on their lives. What Senator Foley's bill would do is affect negatively the lives of young women. We're never going to stop people from having sex, licit or illicit. We're not going to be able to stop priests from doing it, cardinals, bishops. And we know from history that birds do it, popes do it, bees and little fleas do it. Everybody does it. So the passage of legislation has to deal with the reality that we find in this world, and that's what Senator Schimek's amendment attempts to do. I hope you will adopt my amendment which deals only with the matter of confidentiality. Mr. President, I will ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.
