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Legislature, if you're looking at Senator Schimek's amendment, you will see that the information being discussed in her amendment is the language that Senator Foley's bill would repeal, so I don't have to go into that right now. But I think in her amendment we can place the same language that currently is in the law. After line 16, this is what my amendment would insert: "Information developed by the State Department of Education and approved by the State Board of Education may be used to comply with this section." The reason that I am offering that amendment is because the information that has been developed by the State Department of Education and approved by the State Board of Education after public hearing exists now. Some schools make use of it to comply with the current law. That information is nonjudgmental. It does not advocate abortion. It simply points out the information relative to what has been called judicial bypass. I don't want anybody to have an excuse not to support Senator Schimek's amendment if the reason for that nonsupport would be that a distrust relative to the type of information that would be given exists. I would like to see the law stay as it is. I've said that repeatedly and I will repeat it again and again as the opportunities present themselves. This is what Senator Schimek's amendment says: "At least one employee of each school in each school district with students in grades seven through twelve must keep on file current written materials that explain the provisions in section 71-6902 with regard to the requirements for parental notification as a condition for obtaining an abortion." That is the first thing that the material must point out--the necessity of parental notification as a condition to obtaining an abortion. Her language continues: "and the provisions of sections 71-6903 and 71-6904 with regard to seeking a judicial waiver of the parental notification requirements." So there are two components. The first is that the written material must explain that parental notification is required of somebody below a certain age as a condition to obtaining an abortion. That's component one. The second component deals with the judicial waiver which allows a young girl, if she can persuade a judge, to obtain an abortion without parental notification. To continue Senator Schimek's amendment: If such employee of the school is approached by a student in grades seven through twelve with a personal inquiry regarding the topic of abortion,
