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the (sic) employee shall provide the student with such written materials. "The employee may provide additional information regarding the subject matter if he or she deems it relevant to the student's particular situation. Providing these materials shall not be grounds for termination of such employee's employment with the school district." That is the information that is to be given, but there is no detail setting out in Senator Schimek's amendment of what that information should consist of or the form it should take. My amendment would add this sentence: "Information developed by the State Department of Education and approved by the State Board of Education may be used to comply with this section." This prevents a school or an employee from feeling that he or she, the employee that is, or the school administration are unable to come up with neutral language which neither advocates nor speaks against the young woman's right to obtain an abortion. This bill does not affect a woman's right to obtain an abortion. That right has been guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution, as interpreted by the U.S. Supreme Court. So her right to obtain an abortion is there and intact, regardless of what we do. When Nebraska put into the law that a woman below a certain age cannot obtain an abortion without her parents' consent, it became necessary, based on the opinions of some of us, that such a young woman have an opportunity to avoid obtaining parental notification if to do so would jeopardize her in any way. The method decided on was to allow her to talk to a judge, make her case, and if she does, she need not give parental notification and she can obtain an abortion. With Senator Foley's bill, no information about the judicial waiver will be provided by the school. No information about the necessity of obtaining parental consent will be provided by the school. What Senator Foley and others have focused on is the information about the judicial waiver. But the very first thing the written information has to establish is that a woman below a certain age cannot obtain an abortion without parental consent, period. That has to be in the information. The judicial waiver is what I'm interested in being sure that the young women know about. Senator Schimek's amendment is based on language that had been worked out by different groups who have an interest in this subject matter, meaning the providing of this information within the school systems. Senator Schimek explained that...I'd like to ask
