given final consideration. Bohlke said she thought LB 132 solved a problem, but she would pull it from the agenda if it was going to receive extensive debate, and so on. And, obviously, it does concern what we're talking about here today and I do think that there was a kind of a compromise that originally put this part into legislation, and I would certainly support putting it back in again. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Chambers, and, Senator Chambers, this would be your third time on the amendment. This would be your third time now on this amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I hope time isn't running.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, we're not...we're going to start your time right now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. I'm going to go back to this information put out by the Nebraska Department of Education. I don't know that it has ever been read into the record, but I want anybody who would review what it is we've debated to see the reasonable type of information which some people on this floor think ought not be made available to young women. The next item on this sheet under all caps is LEGAL HELP. The pregnant woman can get free legal help. If she asks, the court will provide her with an attorney at no cost to her. Because the person is below the age of 18, it is clear she may not understand the law, probably will not understand the law, likely will not understand the law, and such is the case with many of my colleagues, not only on this but other issues that come before us. So it is deemed of such consequence that accurate information be given, that free legal counsel will provide...be provided the young woman. Harking back to the item just before this one, when she comes to the courthouse, there is a location where these waiver forms are found and she need not ask for one. She can pick one up or she can send a friend to pick one up. After LEGAL HELP comes, in all caps, MEETING WITH THE JUDGE. The judge will meet privately with the pregnant woman, her attorney, and any other person she wants to be present. How many on the floor knew these things? How many even had an interest in these things? Probably not many because
