SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend Senator Schimek's amendment with FA1440. (Legislative Journal page 485.)

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on amendment FA1440.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm back to an amendment that I withdrew the other day. In line 6, I would strike the word "for" and insert the word "to." The current language says "as a condition for obtaining an abortion." The word should be "to." Conditions are attached to something. Conditions are not attached for. Conditions are attached to. Since this is going to continue to be before us, I've got to go ahead and see if I can at least make this change. The amendment is not difficult to understand.
