feel that this bill is not the best solution for our students and that there are other alternatives out there. I'm offering this one today that would simply provide students with notification that this information is available to them in schools. I don't think that's unreasonable. I don't think it's burdensome. In fact, I don't really think the one sheet of paper at the beginning of the year is burdensome either. And I think that superintendents have to deal with people in the public who may not always be entirely happy with everything they do. That's part of their job. That's what they get paid for. And that's what you and I get paid for too, right? But I think that overall that provision of the original LB 425 has been good and it's been important, and I would ask you to please consider this amendment as an alternative to the provisions of LB 172. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. The Chair would recognize Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment that Senator Schimek offers is, as she pointed out, a watered-down version, but to somebody who is dying of thirst a watered-down drink of water is good. As with all of her other amendments, I support this one, because there is a heavy principle involved in all of our discussion. That principle is the right of young women to have this information, and the corollary is a duty that I, as a public official, have to do all that I can to be sure that this information is available. I don't know how much my colleagues have paid attention to the discussion. I don't know how much of their time they've given. I don't know how much interest they have taken. But it seems to me that when men are bringing bills that impinge negatively on women, it's simply an extension of that rah-rah testosterone-driven notion of machismo, according to which women are to be dominated by men. In the real world, women demonstrate much greater strength, morally and physically, than men. A man might practice and become a football player. A man might train and lift weights. So, because there is a disparity, generally speaking, between the size of a male human being and a female human being, the male, generally speaking, is going to have a greater amount of muscular strength.
