SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now tell me about this needing to control the speed of an oncoming vehicle. Is that what the two of you said, or did you say something else? Maybe I misunderstood.

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's exactly what I said. My point was there is no way that we can control the speed of the other vehicle. There's no way that either one of the amendments before us can control the speed of the other vehicle. To me, that is the whole problem and that's what we're trying to correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't see, in Senator Quandahl's amendment, anything relative to another vehicle. Can you point that out to me?

SENATOR AGUILAR: No, no, I don't think you're following me. I'm not making myself clear enough, I guess. What my answer to Senator Quandahl was, your amendment wouldn't do a bit of good because, although his vehicle is traveling at a safe amount of speed, there's nothing in there that says how do you control the speed of the other drivers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The speed of what other drivers?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Any other driver on the street.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why do you have to control the speed of any other driver on the street?

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's my point. You can't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this amendment doesn't deal with the speed of any other driver on the street. How does it...how does...

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's why I think it's an ineffective amendment, Senator.
