SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Senator Aguilar, you can improve my education this morning. How does...does your bill have anything to do with the speed of other vehicles on the street?

SENATOR AGUILAR: No, it simply keeps people belted in their vehicles when they're hit by another vehicle on the street.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why do we care about other vehicles on the street when we're talking about Senator Quandahl's amendment? If his amendment is adopted, it has nothing to do with other vehicles on the street. If it is not adopted, your bill has nothing to do with the speed of other vehicles on the street. Isn't that true?

SENATOR AGUILAR: My bill creates a safer environment because of the speed of other vehicles on the street.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But your bill does not say anything about other vehicles at all, does it?

SENATOR AGUILAR: No, it's not intended to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you only want to inject that in opposition to Senator Quandahl's and my amendment. Isn't that true?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Absolutely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could a person fall off one of these vehicles and be harmed?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Very easily.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, you're not controlling the speed of other vehicles that might run over that person, are you?

SENATOR AGUILAR: If he's belted in, there's less opportunity that will happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could a person who is in the trunk...not the trunk but the cargo area of one of these vehicles...and might be
