people? Do you think there are some such critters on this floor?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. My time is up, I think.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Quandahl, on the Chambers amendment to your amendment.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, one point that hasn't been made yet with respect to LB 227 is that this is a criminal statute. It would make a driver of a vehicle, if convicted, a criminal and subject to not only a criminal conviction, but also a fine, a loss of points on their driver's license. And so, as such, a statute like this needs to be strictly construed. And, frankly, when I first started looking at LB 227, there will be some...if the discussion goes on, we can bring up the fact that there are a number of terms in the original LB 227 that are not defined in the statutes. Among them are "caravan," "parades," and "exhibition." As a matter of fact, when I looked and tried to find some of...some definitions for those particular exemptions to the statute that Senator Aguilar has proposed here, about the only one I did find is, is that there is some language dealing with "exhibition," but that deals with statutes more about what Janet Jackson did the other night at the halftime show than it does with a criminal statute dealing with driving in a parade or a caravan. And so I found that interesting that the statutory definition of an "exhibition" doesn't have anything to do with driving around in a car. So I just wanted to make that point. Senator Aguilar did indeed say, you know, Mark, I appreciate your amendment, but how are we going to control the speed of the other vehicles on the roadway? Well, I would point out that it already is against the law to speed. It already is against the law to drive your car or vehicle in a careless or negligent fashion, or even a reckless fashion. It already is against the law to disregard traffic signals, stop signs and the like. And so there are already laws on the books to try to...the Rules of the Road apply to all vehicles and, yet, we know that at times, Senator Aguilar is right, we cannot control everything that goes on in
