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Senator Quandahl presented to me, to the body, I can tell you, Senator Aguilar, that it gives me a treasure-trove. Whenever an amendment is offered that has a number, then the treasure-trove is thereby given. And since I've offered an amendment, he can't withdraw his amendment just because he doesn't like what I'm doing. And I assure you that I intend to keep us on this bill a long time, and I'm going to see if the Speaker will put your bill up three days in a row as he did LB 172. I must do things to find out what the rules are according to which we function. Senator Friend, as short a time as you've been here, you've heard me say, if you've paid attention to any of those many repetitious statements of mine, I don't care what the rules are; I just need to know what they are. So I want to see if we're going to stay on Senator Aguilar's bill for three days. I only have about an hour and a half to go to burn off the rest of this morning. Then we have two additional days, and I'm sure that you would insist on the same consideration that others are being given. So if my amendment is not adopted on the first go-around, I'm going to try to strike that nail a second time and see if I can get it adopted on the second go-round. That means I would try to get the body to reconsider their action in rejecting my amendment. But we definitely are going to be on this bill. And I will tell you one of the things I'm going to try to do. I'm going to try to strike everything in your bill and insert in its place one of the amendments that Senator Schimek was unsuccessful in attaching to LB 172, and I shall do that on other bills, and I'm sure that you or somebody will advise you to challenge the germaneness. Probably a ruling will come from the Chair that will displease one or the other of us, but not being a mind reader I cannot say with certitude what the Chair's ruling will be. However, your bill is going to be an instrumentality or vehicle for education in the parliamentary processes that we'll be observing the rest of the session. I would calculate that if each bill can be given 3 days, then in 20 days...I mean, if we had 20 bills, that would be 60 days, and that's not even talking about the budget bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But Senator Foley suggested that it be done this way, and the body agreed. There were things that needed to
