SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: White people could not survive under the circumstances that black people face. I look at things around this Legislature, in this Capitol building, this state government, and white people in politics, and I see them whine and cry and act as though they're being mistreated when all they've been subjected to is criticism. And they're adults. Then they want to dummy up and pretend that they don't understand why a black person such as myself is outraged when black children are mistreated in a public school in the way these black children were. Those white kids do need to be taught. Obviously, their parents, their churches, and the schools cannot do it. At a later date, in another place, somebody will give them the education they're not getting now. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Aguilar, on the Chambers amendment to the Quandahl.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I would like to address a couple of things that Senator Quandahl touched on. He talked about definition of the word "caravan" and not being able to find it in law. I will say that it is in law. You know, we found it in a particular entrance...instance, and I'll be glad to look that up and show it to you again. Secondly, and more importantly, I think, in the Beutler amendment, which I hope becomes the bill, we've taken that word out of there. It's not even there. So that argument kind of goes down the tubes. Some of the other things that he touched on was, this law would not apply if you're riding in a hearse. Personally, I'd go on record as saying that's why this law is in effect, so you don't have to ride in that hearse, okay? Secondly, it's not as likely that you're going to fall out of a hearse or an ambulance, because they are enclosed. A pickup is not, and that's the whole point. And I understand Senator Quandahl's objections to this, you know. He told me why he wanted to do his amendments, and it is strictly to allow Boy Scouts to be able to ride in the back of a pickup for a paper drive. That's all well-intentioned. You know, that's a great idea. But I contend to him that those Boy Scouts' lives
