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that's their right. I think there have been individuals that have chastised what's been put in there, and maybe rightfully so. But again, that is the way that our process is set up. But let's be clear about something. Just because there's a petition on the ballot doesn't mean individuals are going to vote for it. They're not necessarily inclined to vote for it automatically, as been told us today on the floor, and the reason that we're told the petition is out there is because of our inability to act. As I read the individuals that are supportive of it, and the reason why they want the petition to pass is because of our actions. The cities that are pushing the petition would get revenue, and the reason why they claim they need the revenue is because of the decisions made by this Legislature to cut their state aid, so they want more money. And the guise they're using is, well, you know what, it will lower your property taxes. No, it won't. That's what they said in Iowa and that's not happening either. So, in fairness to the discussion here, I think the petition is an interesting dynamic that we get to deal with, as lawmakers in the state of Nebraska, in regards to how we respond. I think you can point to a number of areas where we failed to respond and, because of that, we probably got something we didn't want. But that's the reality of the process that we operate under. Whether or not we decide as a body to put out LR 14CA is immaterial, probably, to the petition. Senator Cunningham also mentioned the other petition that's out there, and you can appeal it all you want and find a judge or court that may rule that way, but I believe that the existing ruling that we have is a pretty sound one. There is more than one issue in that petition. And the reason why I would say that that's probably a pretty sound one is because we now have three petitions filed that were in response because it was from a similar group of people. So let's be clear about the discussion. You're being asked whether or not you should allow casinos all over the state of Nebraska, if you vote for AM2401, in addition to casinos on the Indian reservations, in addition to the fact that you could also authorize the Legislature then to control other forms of gambling related to casinos by statutory authority. Now, you can get 30 votes to put a bill on...or put a constitutional amendment on the ballot. That doesn't mean people are going to vote for it. And you could put something out that people might vote for, but that doesn't mean
