SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...has been hurt by that one vote, that one motion, that one expansion of gambling. I just would pray that each one of you would examine your own conscience as to whether we move down this road to expand gambling for our citizens. You know, there isn't anything that says, even if this Legislature puts forth a constitutional amendment, is that one going to be selected over the one, two, three, four, now five? I believe, Senator Schimek, if that's correct, there will be five on the ballot that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Was that a question, Senator Jensen?

SENATOR JENSEN: Time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Are you asking her a question?

SENATOR JENSEN: No.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you. (Laugh) But I believe there are five and then plus the legislation, LR 14CA, if that goes on the ballot, there's going to be six. Who's going to pick which one they want to vote for? I don't know. And then what happens if...
